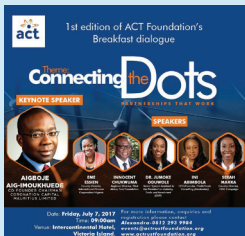
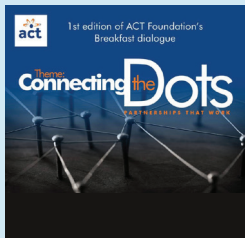
in the social, private and public sectors debate and discuss the theme for the year.

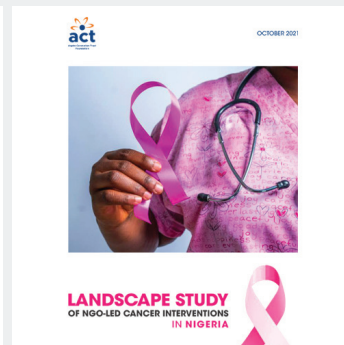
